



Rehabilitation workshop: presentation of the professions and means of evaluation

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Abstract :

Profession: Oro-maxillo-facial physiotherapist

The profession of masseur-physiotherapist dates back to 1946. The curriculum begins with a PASS or STAPS degree with a health option, followed by four years at an IFMK. The teaching is theoretical and practical with many internships, including private practice placements. The studies are validated by a thesis. The diploma obtained is a state diploma (DE)

The skills in OMF physiotherapy are acquired in post-graduate training. OMF physiotherapy is prescribed. Rehabilitation is understood as a series of sessions preceded by a 1st session, the kinesitherapeutic diagnostic assessment (BDK). The BDK is the examination of the patient's praxis capacities. The following are studied:

ventilation, swallowing, chewing, olfaction, phonation, non-verbal communication, mandibular function and postural attitude. In rehabilitation, the OMF physiotherapist will use a demonstrative teaching method based on anatomical models, mouth puppets, diagrams, video-controlled scenarios... Kindness and an encouraging attitude are essential to accompany the patient in his progress.

Profession: Speech and language therapist

The first certificates of study in speech and language therapy were issued in France in 1955 under the impetus of Suzanne Borel-Maisonny, the founder of this specialty, and a specialist in the rehabilitation of children with cleft palates. The speech and language therapist, who holds a certificate of competence (5 years of post-baccalaureate studies), works with people who are likely to have communication, language, other cognitive activities and oro-myofacial disorders. He works on medical prescription and conducts his rehabilitation after making his diagnosis during the assessment that he conducts. He works with patients of all ages and rehabilitates phonation disorders linked to velo-pharyngeal dysfunction, velo-tubo-tympanic disorders, oro-facial functions and swallowing disorders. The rehabilitation of the oro-my-facial functions requires devices for the evaluation and rehabilitation of the velo-pharyngeal function, the voice and the facial musculature.

Profession: Osteopath-Kinesiotherapist

The profession was born at the end of the 19th century in the USA. Dr. Still proposed another way of treating, "manual", through the study of anatomy and nature. Osteopathy is practiced today by osteopathic physicians, osteopathic physiotherapists, and osteopaths who are mono-members. Osteopathic practice is medical in the United States, academic in England and in many countries in Europe, except France.

The training is characterized by the learning of the fundamental subjects, the perception of the body and the gesture. Apart from the currents within osteopathy, we identify: A diagnosis and a treatment mainly manual. The systemic approach and the singularity of the patient. Confidence in the patient's ability to self-regulate and an identification between life and movement within the environment. It is optimizing health through the functionality of the body, which calls for multidisciplinary. OMF treatments illustrate this therapeutic approach
