

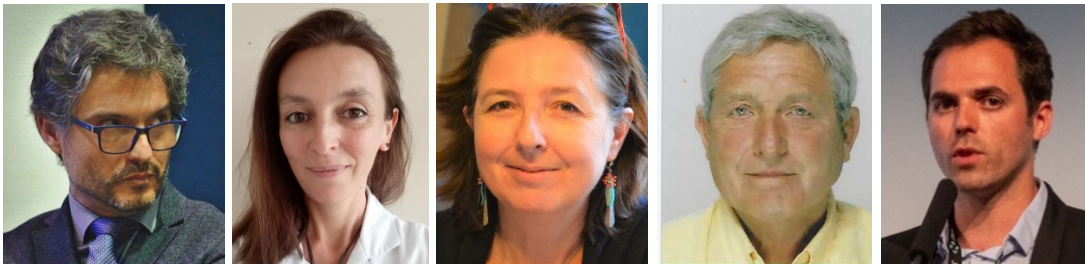

Abstract :

The alveolar-dental, skeletal, muscular, or mixed origins of anterior infraocclusion make orthodontic, surgical, and rehabilitative management complex and uncertain. Surgical and orthodontic appliances do not always stand the test of time. A collective work, including the patients, is often necessary. The speakers will present the case of a patient with an anterior infraclusia who relapsed after orthodontic-surgical treatment. She will have been examined by each of the speakers, who will give a short report of the examination performed. A discussion will follow with the audience. Finally, therapeutic proposals will be made.
