



## **Pediatric cystic lesions, multidisciplinary management and exceptional cases**

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**Abstract :**

Cystic tumors of the oral cavity in children are a frequent but largely under-diagnosed group of diseases. This delay in management by the various authors involved in the clinical examination of the child can lead to complications of varying nature and intensity. This oral communication will illustrate the cases of two young patients in whom the fortuitous discovery of maxillary cystic lesions led to their surgical removal.

We will detail their management and the diagnostic challenges we faced. We will then provide a clear and precise picture of this type of oral involvement. We will also discuss the risk of complications and loss of opportunity in case of delayed diagnosis. The local and systemic complications and the risks to the child's development will be explained, thus justifying the interest of a systematic annual dental and oral cavity examination in children. We conclude with the interest of all caregivers, dentists, surgeons, family doctors and pediatricians, to succeed in this large-scale management.
